Dear Saint Mary Friends,

In November the Church devotes special attention to those who have died and await heaven. From our catechism we know that the living have two specific duties regarding them: the Corporal Work of Mercy "to bury the dead," and the Spiritual Work of Mercy "to pray for the dead."

In this regard, the Mystical Body of Christ takes the Scripture seriously. Second Maccabees notes that after a fierce battle Judas Maccabeus sent a collection to Jerusalem for a sacrificial offering on behalf of his dead soldiers. *In doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way, inasmuch*

as he had the resurrection in mind.... Thus, he made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin. (12:43-46)

Similarly, a sincere cry from the depths of each of us has been prayed at wakes and burials, that our beloved dead may be purified and to speed their journey to Heaven. Most importantly, we offer the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on behalf of the deceased at the Mass of Christian Burial.

Why? The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives this serious teaching: "Each man receives his eternal retribution in his immortal soul at the very moment of his death, in a particular judgement that refers his life to Christ: either entrance into the blessedness of heaven-through purification or immediately, or immediate and everlasting damnation." (CCC:1022).

Those who have lived in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified enter into Heaven immediately on death while those who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly so, will first undergo purification. The Church gives the name 'Purgatory' to this reality.

Thanks be to God for his mercy purifying us in his life even after death!



But even without the catechism's authoritative teaching, praying for those who have died not in mortal sin makes absolute sense. I am meant for heaven, meant to be in God's presence. So what is needed?

If when I die an angry, impatient man, what happens to that anger and impatience? If I die with some attachment to lust, what happens to that impurity in me? If I die with some attachment to pride, sloth, envy, etc., what happens to those sins in me? They are still a part of me and before being able to enter the presence of God, to fully enjoy the beatific vision for eternity, must be purified and transformed into holiness.

St. John Henry Newman proposes that when standing before the Lord at our deaths, and seeing our true state, we will beg for Purgatory.

And so this month is dedicated to the holy souls being purified. We on earth can help them in their purification. The Church from the very beginning has always cared for the dead by offering Masses, prayers, almsgiving, indulgences and works of penances on their behalf.

Such is the beauty of membership in the Mystical Body of Christ.


